2020 Outlook

 - Declining participation

 - More clubs are holding two-day events
- Increased activity at some Central & Southern California clubs

 - LA Clays
 - New Triple B
- Ammo purchase requirements may scare OS shooters
- Clean up CSCA nonprofit status
- Possible changes coming for sub-gauge classification
